Gosal, Professor Emeritus, Panjab University, Chandigarh. Besides, senior teachers of the subject like Dr. S.S. Dhillon, Principal J.S. Kaliana, Dr. H.S. Mangat, Dr. Seet Singh and Kanwar Surjit Singh, Secretary General of the ISPER and Ex. Chief Town Planner Haryana, graced the occasion. Dr. S.S. Dhillon, Patron of the conference welcomed the guests and delegates. Dr. H.S. Mangat, gave a brief introduction about the APG and its activities in the last year.

In his key note address on, "Urban Growth: Challenges and Trends" Dr. K.D. Sharma, Department of Geography, Panjab University, Chandigarh highlighted the trends and issues related with urbanization with special reference to India.

A prestigious research project of Rs. 6.55 lakh on "Women and Child Trafficking from Nepal: Issues, Efforts and Challenges" has been awarded to Dr. Vinod K. Bhardwaj, Lecturer in Geography, Govt. College, Chimanpura, Rajasthan. This project is funded by B P Koirala Foundation of India and Nepal (BPKF). It is a joint venture of India and Nepal.

College, Ludhiana presented a research paper in the International Geographical Union (IGU) Commission Seminar on Land use, Biodiversity and Climate Change, organize by Department of Geography, Cotton College, Guwahati from 11-13 December, 2010.

GEOGRAPHICAL NEWS

China's One Child Policy : China completed 30 years of one child policy on 25^{th} September 2010. This

was meant to be effective for 30 years but China will continue it for another decade.

The Chinese Academy of Social Sciences estimated that by 2020 AD, 24 million marriageable Chinese men may be wifeless because of one child policy and preference for male progeny that has created an imbalance of 119 Chinese boys to 100 girls H.T.

Demand for Water will Exceed the Supply: By 2030 water shortages are expected to aggregate 40 per cent in developing Asia and in some countries like India, demand may exceed supply by 50 per cent, according to a draft report of the Asian Development Bank TNS.

Earth Like Planet: A team of astronomers from University of California has discovered a planet orbiting a star some 20 light years away, which they claim is almost earth like yet found and so very much likely to be habitable. The new planet a rocky world-three times the size of Earth, lies in the Star's 'Goldilocks Zone', the region in space where conditions are neither too hot nor too cold for liquid water to form oceans, lakes and rivers H.T.

Cancun Summit: The UN climate conference in Cancun on December 11, 2010 (after Kyoto in Japan) and Copenhagen in Denmark reached a 'compromise' to set up a \$ 100 billion (Green Fund) to fight global warming, but there was no agreement on extending the landmark Kyoto protocol on emission cuts beyond 2012. Briefly:

- 1) 90 countries agreed on conference text.
- 2) No compromise on extending Kyoto protocol beyond 2012.
- 3) Summit endorses non-binding deals reached at Copenhagen.
- 4) No legally binding emission cuts.
- 5) Developing countries to be subjected to international verification only if they receive funds for emission cut machinery.
- 6) Green Climate Fund to protect poor nations.
- 7) Next U.N. meet to be held at Durban. (S. Africa)-The Tribune.
