The papers received later than September10, 2011 will not be considered for evaluation. The name of the author and department should be mentioned in the covering letter and not on the paper to keep the secrecy.

An expert committee of three geographers will be constituted to evaluate and short list three to five best papers. These papers will be presented in a special session of the conference and one amongst them would be finally selected for Dr. Saminderjeet Singh Young Geographer Award. The awardee will be honoured with a cash award of Rs. 1000/-, a memento and a certificate of merit. The paper will be published in the Journal if considered fit for publication.

JOINT MEETING OF APG AND ISPER

To explore the possibilities of further strengthening the co-operation and sco-ordination between APG and ISPER, a joint meeting of the Executive Committee of the APG and Executive Council (EC) of the ISPER was held under the Chairmanship of Sh. R.C. Aggarwal, President ISPER on 23.4. 2011 at ISPER Head Ouarters, Panchkula. K. Surjit Singh, Secretary General ISPER, while appreciating the academic potentials of the APG informed the EC the objective of holding a joint meeting. The intended objectives are further strengthening co-operation in research activities of the Institute. In view of this, it was resolved to build Geographers Bhawan jointly at Patiala which will function as subcentre of ISPER apart from head quarters of APG. To work out modalities in this regard a sub-committee of four members, two each from APG and ISPER was constituted.

GEOGRAPHICAL NEWS

Eco-Disaster: Nearly a million hectares of forests have been cleared for the 11282 projects over the last 30 years in India. Industry and infrastructural projects repeatedly flout India's forest environment and tribal right laws.

Census 2011:

- Provisional population totals of Census 2011 reveal that India is now 1.21 billion.
- In just 10 years India added 181 million equal to the population of Brazil.
- India's population at present is almost equal to the combined population of USA, Indonesia, Brazil, Bangaladesh, Pakistan and Japan.
- India is the home of 17.5 per cent of world's population as compared to 19.4 per cent living in China.
- For the first time since 1921 India's growth rate has slowed down to 17.64 per cent as compared to 21.12 per cent in previous decade (1991-2001).
- India recorded an improvement in sex ratio from 933 in 2001 to 940 in 2011.
- Literacy rate also improved from 64.83 per cent in 2001 to 74.04 per cent in 2011.
- With 11279 persons/sq. km, Delhi recorded highest density of population followed by Chandigarh with 9252 persons/sq. km.
- Punjab has 550 persons/sq. km as compared to national average of 352 persons/sq. km.
- Punjab also recorded improvement in sex ratio from 876 in 2001 to 893 in 2011.
