World Disaster Report 2011

- Every year around 13 million babies are born with low birth weight defined by WHO as below 2,500 grams and are at increased risk of dying at or soon after birth. About half of these babies are born in south-central Asia (UNSCN, 2010).
- Every year some 9 million children across the world die before they reach their fifth birthday, and about one-third of these untimely deaths are attributed to under nutrition.
- By 2020 diet-related chronic diseases are projected to account for almost three-quarters of all deaths worldwide, and 60 per cent of these will be in low- and middle-income countries (WHO).
- Eight states Bihar, Chhatisgarh, Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh, Orissa, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal have more desperately poor people than the 26 poorest African nations.
