The Geospatial Information Regulation Bill, 2016 (Available on the internet)

A Bill to regulate the acquisition, dissemination, publication and distribution of Geo-spatial information of India which is likely to affect the security, sovereignty and integrity of India and for matters connected therewith or incidental is to be enacted by the Parliament in the Sixty-Seventh Year of the Republic of India. It prohibits the acquisition, publication and use of geospatial information including maps without obtaining licence from authorities concerned.

Penalty for illegal acquisition of geospatial information of India:

Whoever acquires any geospatial information of India in contravention of section 3, shall be punished with a fine ranging from Rupees one Crore to Rupees one hundred Crore and/or imprisonment for a period up to seven years.

Representation by APG

The Executive Committee of the Association of Punjab Geographers has pleaded to the Ministry of Home Affairs that teaching and research departments using geospatial information may be kept out of the ambit of the bill. The copy of representation has also been submitted to the Ministry of Human Resource Development and UGC for necessary information and appropriate intervention in the larger interest of the geographers' community.

NEWS FROM THE DEPARTMENTS

Department of Geography, Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra

A remarkable academic and geographically directed mega event like 37th IIG Meet and International Conference on the theme, 'Land Resource Policies, Agriculture and Expanding Urban-industrial Spaces' was organized by the Department of Geography, Kurukshetra University on February 11-13, 2016. About 350 geographers, earth scientists and social scientists from 20 Universities and 18 States of India and abroad

participated actively in this conference. In his presidential address, Prof. M H Qureshi from JNU pointed out how the land resource policies in India shaped the agricultural patterns and influenced the conditions of farmers. Professor Amitabh Kundu highlighted the dynamics of Indian economy and its relation with land acquisition policies and plethora of urban problems during his Keynote Address.

In three plenary sessions, 7 special lectures by invited resource persons; Prof. Sachidanand Sinha (JNU), Sh. K.Surjit Singh (ISPER, Panchkula), Prof. Ronki Ram (PU, Chandigarh), Prof. R.B. Bhagat (IIPS, Mumbai), Prof. Veena Joshi (Pune University), Prof. R Ramachandriah (CESS, Hyderabad) and Prof. Shrawan Kumar Acharya (JNU) were delivered. Besides this, there was a panel discussion on the theme, 'Regional Development and Disparities in India' where Prof. B.S. Butola (JNU) and Prof. Krishan Mohan (PU, Chandigarh) initiated debate. IIG also introduced Prof. A B Mukerji Memorial Lecture. The first lecture in the memory of his teacher was delivered by Prof. M N Kaul, from University of Jammu.

Six students participated in Young Geographer Award competition and presented their research work. During the 24 technical sessions, 174 research papers were presented. Professor K.D. Sharma from Panjab University, Chandigarh delivered the Valedictory Address and put in perspective the academic deliberations held during the conference.

Department of Geography, Panjab University, Chandigarh

A two day National Seminar on 'Agriculture and Food Security in India: Challenges and Opportunities' was organized by the Department of Geography, Panjab University on March 10-11, 2016. Various national and foreign delegates such as from Punjab Agricultural University; University of the Fraser Valley, Canada; University of Newcastle, U.K.; Maharana Pratap University of Agriculture and Technology, Udaipur; JNU, New Delhi; University of Delhi, and many more made their presence. Prof. Dhian Kaur, Department of Geography, PU introduced the theme of the conference. She emphasized that agriculture is a crucial sector, and problems faced are many, like economic viability, environmental sustainability and global competitiveness. Keynote Address was given by Prof. Garry Fehr, who highlighted that Second Green Revolution is not possible with the similar attributes as that of the First one. He talked about various new innovative technologies gaining attention in order to have maximum output from limited resources in environmentally sustainable manner.

Dr. Christopher Gibbins, Consul General, Canadian Consulate at Chandigarh highlighted the common area of research and development between India and Canada in the field of agriculture. Prof. B. S Dhillon, Vice Chancellor, Punjab Agriculture University, Ludhiana in his presidential address highlighted the misconceptions related to productivity in Punjab. He shared the facts on the scenarios of Indian per capita availability of food grains and stressed on the strategies for accelerating growth in agriculture sector, while stating alarming problem of declining water table in Punjab due to rice cultivation and policy issues.

The Valedictory Session was chaired by Prof. G.S. Kalkat, Chairman Punjab State Farmers Commission. Prof. M.H. Qureshi of CSRD, JNU, New Delhi delivered the Valedictory Address. He highlighted the numerous challenges that agriculture sector is facing in India, owing to its vastness and diversity.
