20th APG Meet and National Conference

Department of Geography, Govt. Department of Geography, Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra

The 21 days Capacity Building Summer Training Programme on 'Geospatial Technologies' supported by Natural Resources Data Management System (NRDMS), Department of Science and Technology, New Delhi was organized by Department of Geography, Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra from 27th May to 16th June, 2019. The main objective of this training programme was to build knowledge and adaptation capacity of geospatial technologies at various levels by utilizing open platform of Geospatial data and softwares. It was attended by 25 participants from 6 states of India, which were selected by DST through centralized application form in January, 2019. The participants were largely teachers and researchers from different disciplines working in different Govt. and non- Govt. organizations. During this training programme, the participants were trained to process the remote sensing data of various satellite sensors and to integrate it with GIS and GPS using open source software, namely GIS. The participants have also been

working on 5 mini projects using the open platform data and techniques which they learnt during 21 days of training. The training program was inaugurated by Prof. K C Sharma, Vice Chancellor of Kurukshetra University. The keynote speech was delivered by Dr. V S Arya, Director, Haryana Space Application Centre, Hisar, by giving an overview of Indian Space Programme and its application. On its valedictory function, Dr. Rajeshwari, Coordinator of the programme thanked all the supporting agencies, resource persons, participants and members of the faculty for their active support to make the workshop a grand success.

Geographical and Environmental Issues

1. India's only active volcano on the boil again in Andaman and Nicobar

The Barren Island volcano, India's only active volcano, in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands has begun to spew lava and ash. Geologists observe that the eruption could be linked to the recent earthquake that rocked Indonesia. The International Energy Agency (IEA) report on carbon dioxide emissions, India emitted 2,299 million tonnes of carbon dioxide in 2018. India has witnessed an increase of 4.8 per cent from last year.

3. Goldman Environmental Prizes 2019

Six grassroots environmental activists from around the world received prestigious Goldman Environmental Prizes 2019 held at San Francisco Opera House in California. Their names are, Linda Garcia (US), Ana ColovicLesoska (North Macedonia), BayarjargalAgvaantseren (Mongolia), Alfred Brownell (Liberia), Jacqueline Evans (Cook Islands) and Alberto Curamil (Chile).

4. A new model suggests lost continents for early Earth

Scientists at the University of Adelaide have published two studies on a model of rock radioactivity over billions of years which found that the Earth's continental crust may have been thicker, much earlier, than current models suggest, with continents possibly present as far back as four billion years.

5. How trees could save the climate

Around 0.9 billion hectares of land worldwide would be suitable for reforestation, which could ultimately capture two-thirds of human-made carbon emissions. A study shows that this would be the most effective method to combat climate change.

6. By 2050, climate change may threaten human existence

A report released by the Breakthrough National Centre for Climate Restoration, an Australian think tank, warns of a threat to human existence because of climate change. Unlike previous reports on the matter, including the IPCC report, this report flags that scientific predictions, till now, have underestimated the severity of the crisis, and says the world is on the path to 3 degree Celsius or more warming by 2100.

7. Exotic trees eating up Western Ghats' grasslands

The New Year herald's bad news for the high-altitude grasslands of the Western Ghats. Over four decades, the country lost almost one-fourth of these grasslands and exotic invasive trees are primarily to blame, find scientists. Though grassland afforestation using pine, acacia and eucalyptus ceased in 1996, the exotics still invade these ecosystems, confirms a study published on January 2, 2019 in the International Journal on Biological Conservation.

8. Sahara swung between lush and desert conditions every 20,000 years, in sync with monsoon activity

The Sahara Desert is one of the harshest, most inhospitable places on the planet, covering much of North Africa in some 3.6 million square miles of rock and windswept dunes. But it wasn't always so desolate and parched. Primitive rock paintings and fossils excavated from the region suggest that the Sahara was once a relatively verdant oasis, where human settlements and a diversity of plants and animals thrived. Now researchers at MIT have analysed dust deposited off the coast of West Africa over the last 240,000 years, and found that the Sahara, and North Africa in general, has swung between wet and dry climates every 20,000 years. They say that this climatic pendulum is mainly driven by changes to the Earth's axis as the planet orbits the sun, which in turn affect the distribution of sunlight between seasons -- every 20,000 years, the Earth swings from more sunlight in summer to less, and back again.
